CITY COLLEGE STRIKE—The student "strike" at C. C. N. Y. over the expulsion last week of 21 students raged on the campus from dawn until nightfall yesterday. First, the strikers hoisted a strike banner on the campus staff. When police removed it they formed a parade and produced an effigy, two headed, of President Frederick B. Robinson. This they gleefully burned and here you see them just before the pyre was ignited. Police won the first brush with the students, six officers dispersing a hundred rioters. Later the undergraduate parade was swelled to a thousand marchers—but police said the nice weather was more responsible than the cause itself.
