The fight for academic freedom at City College has taken on a new light-- a light which exposes President Frederick B. Robinson not merely as an avowed friend of Fascism but as a man who does not hesitate to violate the most fundamental of all American civil rights.

18 STUDENTS ARRESTED

Frightened and dismayed at Thursday's huge picket line, a clear indication of the growing student sentiment, President Robinson has instigated the arrest of 18 students and is providing his own lawyer in the hope that the severest sentence will be passed.

Of course, he was wily enough not to have the injunction framed in his own name, but he was not wily enough to cover his traces. The injunction, ostensibly taken out by the Home Owners' Association and the "loyal" student body, was served by one Irving Maiash WHO IS A FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE C.C.N.Y. ADMINISTRATION.

President Robinson has instructed this lawyer to object to any reasonable adjournment of the case for two reasons:

- 1. He is desperately afraid that if the case is put off for even one week, there will be time enough to raise a mass student opposition to the arrest.
- 2. He is afraid to give the students an opportunity to produce witnesses who can prove beyond any doubt that the picketing was orderly.

For these reasons; the trial will be held today at 10 o'clock in the Washington Heights Court, at 151 Street between Convent and Amsterdam Avenues.

COME TO THAT TRIAL AND HEAR PRESIDENT ROBINSON'S LAWYER ATTEMPT TO GET CITY COLLEGE STUDENTS BRANDED AS CRIMINALS, AND SHOW YOUR SUPPORT OF THE OUST ROBINSON MOVEMENT.

Meet at 7 minutes to 10 o'clock at 140 Street and Convent Avenue, there to march with your fellow students to the courthouse.

Please refrain from making any noise in court, or the Magistrate will clear the room of all students.
