TERMED "NOT OF INTEREST TO THE STUDENT BODY" BY EDITORS :

On Thursday, March 4th, the MENORAH-AVUKAH CONFERENCE submitted a story of the CAMPUS concerning its coming meeting in the Great Hall. It was judged as "not of interest to the student body" by the editors. We leave it to you to judge.

Marvin Lowenthal, who will speak in the Great Hall on Thursday at 12 noon under the auspices of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and MENORAH-AVUKAH CONFERENCE is one of the outstanding literary figures in America today. Author, lecturer, world traveler and historian, his most recent book "The Jews of Germany; a Story of Sixteen Centuries", has received the acclaim of foremest critics and of hosts of readers. It is a stirring account of the Jewish past in Germany leading up to the catastrophe that befell them with the entrance of the Nazi regime.

Besides "The Jews of Germany", Mr. Lowenthal is the author of "A World Passed By", the first comprehensive work in any language on the Jewish antiquities of Europe and North Africa; "The Autobiography of Michael de Montaigne", selected, prefaced, arranged, edited and translated from the work of the great French philosopher; and "The Memoirs of Glucckel of Hameln" a first translation of this classic into English with an introductory essay on German-Jowish life in the seventeenth century.

Mr. Lowenthal has written many articles on the cultural and political aspects of Jowish life and has contributed at various times to the Dial. The Freeman, The Nation, The New Republic, and other periodicals. Since 1930. Mr. Lowenthal has lectured extensively throughout the United States, chiefly on European politics and on Jowish issues.

We appeal to the students as to their interest in this story. We believe that a meeting on the subject of the sufferings of the Jews under fascist rule, given by an outstanding authority, presented by the only organization which is trying alleviating measures, is of value to the students of this College.

We have decided to ignore the CAMPUS and its partisan news policy, The meeting will be held as scheduled and we expect a large crowd - in spite of the CAMPUS.
