

HELP THE GUTTERSNIPE WARD OFF THE UMBRELLA

There are two things which can save the 18 suspended students from
draconic action by the Faculty Committee on Discipline; which can reinstate the arbitrarily
and undemocratically suspended student council; which can re-guarantee full civil
liberties to the student body and instructoral staff of the City College, threaten-
ed now more than ever by a reactionary administration. These are:

1. MASS SUPPORT OF STUDENT RIGHTS BY INTERESTED AND INFLUENTIAL ORGANIZATIONS.

A. A delegation from powerful unions, including the I.L.G.W.U., and headed
by Norman Thomas, visited the Mayor Saturday, upon the suggestion of
the Student League for Industrial Democracy, asking for the removal of
Pres. Robinson and the unconditional reinstatement of the Student
Council and the suspended students. LaGuardia is investigating the
case, and will meet the delegation again this Thursday.

B. The American Civil Liberties Union, The Socialist Lawyers Ass'n, and
the I.L.D. have given the students the services of several able
attorneys, including Oswald K. Fraenkel, Max Delson, and E. Kuntz,
