There are two things which can save the 18 suspended students/Iraconic action by the Faculty Committee on Discipline; which can reinstate the arbitrarilland undemocratically suspended student council; which can re-guarantee full civil liberties to the student body and instructoral staff of the City College, threate: now more than ever by a reactionary administration. These are:

- 1. MASS SUPPORT OF STUDENT RIGHTS BY INTERESTED AND INFLUENTIAL ORGANIZATIONS.
 - A. A delegation from powerful unions, including the I.L.G.W.U., and headed by Norman Thomas, visited the Mayor Saturday, upon the suggestion of the Student League for Industrial Democracy, asking for the removal of Pres. Robinson and the unconditional reinstatement of the Student Council and the suspended students. LaGuardia is investigating the case, and will meet the delegation again this Thursday.
 - B. The American Civil Libertiies Union, The Socialist Lawyers Assin, and the I.L.D. have given the students the services of severallable attorneys, including Oswald K. Fraenkel, Mcx Delson, and E. Kuntz,
 - c. The N.Y. Evening Post has already initiated a fight against the Robinson administration, which has been joined in by the World-Telegram, (The Post begins today a series of articles on the suppression of student liberties under the Robinson Regime.)
- 2. UNITED ACTION OF THE STUDENT BODY AND THE INSTUCTORAL STAFF TO FORCE THE RESIGNATION OF PRES. ROBINSON. THE C.C.N.Y. CHAPTER OF THE STUDENT L.I.D. IS PUTTING ALL ITS RESOURCES BEHIND THIS FIGHT.
