Re. United Nations Assistance to the Khmer Rouge Trials Progress made toward the establishment of the Extraordinary Chambers and their related institutions



Note to the Secretary-General

United Nations Assistance to the Khmer Rouge Trials (UNAKRT): Progress made toward the establishment of the Extraordinary Chambers and their related institutions $\leq Q$

Following the issuance of a note verbale, which appealed for contributions of US\$43 million to fund UN assistance to the trials, a briefing was conducted for the Group of Interested States to share with them the outcome of the UN technical mission to Phnom Penh which took place in December 2004. At the briefing indication of pledges amounting to approximately \$30 million were made - \$21.5 million pledged by Japan, whose representative indicated that the full contribution may be available by March of this year. The additional \$8.5 million was pledged by France, UK and Australia.

During the meeting, Japan suggested that an appeal conference be convened at the earliest possible date, to which all Permanent Representatives to the UN would be invited, to draw their attention to the note verbale. I doubt that this will bring in significant contributions. It would be more of a public relations nature but this is something to which the Government of Japan seems to attach significance. I would recommend that we proceed with this and that you be represented at the Conference by either the Legal Counsel or the Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs, with the support of my office.

The major outstanding issue relates to the location of the Extraordinary Chambers. During the technical mission in December 2004, the Government of Cambodia proposed an alternate site to the one which had been agreed to in the Spring of 2004. The new site is some 17 kms outside of Phnom Penh within the newly built High Command Headquarters (HCH) of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces. A technical evaluation of the new site is being conducted.

However, there have been concerns expressed by the Legal Counsel as well as by NGO's regarding the potential negative impact of conducting the trials on the site of an active military facility. In addition to undermining the perceived independence and impartiality of the trials, the location may be intimidating to victims, witnesses and the general public. One avenue to mitigate those concerns would be to accept the new site on the condition that the premises be clearly separated from the military facility and military staff relocated during the duration of the operation. A recommendation for your consideration will be made once we have received further information on the technical, financial and political aspects surrounding this alternate site.
