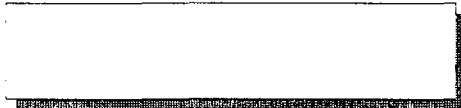

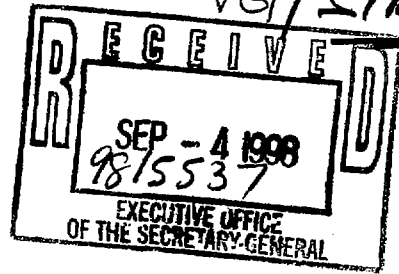

Report on Security Council Resolution 1172 (1998)

1. The Deputy PR of Sweden informed me on Wednesday 2 September that in consultations over the drafting of the Council's programme of work for September, a member of the Council had inquired whether the Secretary-General would be reporting on India and Pakistan in terms of Security Council Resolution 1172. He asked me whether I proposed to brief the Council.

2. I stated that I would need to consult with Mr. Prendergast and the EOSG and suggested that the programme could be made sufficiently flexible so as to allow for briefing in an informal consultation if the Secretary-General deemed it necessary. Mr. Prendergast whom I consulted subsequently agrees with this view.

3. It is relevant to recall that the first report of the Secretary-General in terms of operative paragraph 15 of Security Council Resolution 1172 was on 9 July. There is no specific requirement for regular reporting. However, almost 2 months have elapsed since the first report and since SG would have met the Prime Minister of India (and perhaps the leader of the Pakistan delegation?) and others at the NAM Summit in Durban, the results of these conversations and reports from DPA and DDA could well form the basis of another report. The format of the report - whether written or oral - can be determined by the SG as on the last occasion.

4. Please let me know if a report is contemplated. If so a contribution from DDA will be submitted.
