


NOTE TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Your 1999 record of interviews

About a year ago, you asked us to economize on the time you spend with the media.

In 1999, we did this in three ways:



It worked.

INTERVIEWS: In 1999, you did only 32 interviews at headquarters, less than half the number (76) done in '98.

While travelling, you did only 13 interviews, down from 49 \parallel the year before.

PRESS CONFERENCES at headquarters, a good investment of time in my view, were up from 7 in '98 to 10 in '99. And while on the road, you gave 25 press conferences, almost one in every country visited.

PRESS ENCOUNTERS: You were more active on press encounters, which are good value for the money--109 last year, or about 9 a month.
