

I have the honour to refer to General Assembly resolution 55/281 of 1 August 2001 which requested Governments, regional and sub-regional organizations, as well as relevant civil society actors to consider my report on "Prevention of Armed Conflict" (A/55/985-S/2001/574 and Corr.1) and its recommendations.

In this context, paragraph 3 of the resolution specifically called upon "all relevant organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system to consider, in accordance with their mandates, the recommendations addressed to them and to inform the General Assembly, preferably during its fifty-sixth session, of their views in this regard". In his letter addressed to me dated 29 April 2002 (A/56/935, attached), the President of the General Assembly, H. E. Dr. Han Seung-soo, requested that I bring this matter and my report to your attention. He also requested me to submit a report to the General Assembly "setting out, in consolidated form, any views submitted by the different organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system pursuant to paragraph 3 of its resolution 55/281".

On 30 August 2001, the Security Council also adopted an important resolution on the same report (S/RES/1366 (2001)). The Council stated that "it looks forward to further consideration of the report of the Secretary-General on Prevention of Armed Conflict by the General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council, as well as other actors including the Bretton Woods institutions and supports the development of a system-wide coordinated and mutually supportive approach to prevention of armed conflict".



In light of the importance of conflict prevention for the work of the United Nations, to which I personally attach a high priority, I would be most grateful if you could facilitate early consideration by your organ of my report and its relevant recommendations. The President of the General Assembly wishes to promote active consideration of this issue during the fifty-sixth session of the General Assembly and to facilitate this, I would very much like to transmit the report containing the consolidated views of the United Nations system to the General Assembly at an early date. It would, therefore, be highly appreciated if you could inform me as soon as possible, and preferably no later than 30 June 2002, of the actions taken or contemplated by your organ in this regard.






