

## Dear Mr. President,

I am writing to you on a matter that we have discussed before: the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court.

Since I know that you are presently considering whether the United States of America should sign the Statute, open for signature for only two more days until 31 December 2000, I thought that it might be helpful to inform you that as of today, 132 States have signed the Statute (list attached). The number of ratifications now stands at 27. Six additional States have indicated that they will sign the Statute before this opportunity is lost.

Mr. President, I am appealing to you to add the signature of the United States of America to the Rome Statute. The International Criminal Court is not a threat to States with an organized criminal justice system. It is designed to protect those most vulnerable in situations where their own government, if there is one, is unable or unwilling to prosecute those who violate their most fundamental humanitarian rights. It is designed to help to end the impunity that has caused so much suffering and sorrow among human beings all over the world.

There is still time, and I have made certain that the document is accessible for signature until midnight on 31 December.

Please accept, Mr. President, the assurances of my highest consideration.

*Note:* The Statute was adopted on 17 July 1998 by the United Nations Diplomatic Conference of Plenipotentiaries on the Establishment of an International Criminal Court. In accordance with its article 125, the Statute was opened for signature by all States in Rome at the Headquarters of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations on 17 July 1998. Thereafter, it was opened for signature in Rome at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Italy until 17 October 1998. After that date, the Statute was opened for signature in New York, at United Nations Headquarters, where it will be until 31 December 2000.
